To make this decision easier for you, I have put together a list of my top 10 Christmas picks for jewellery gifts under £15,000. All wonderful jewels that can be worn day or night and on regular occasion; each one would make a very special gift.

Starting with something blue..

The ideal aquamarine ring. Of typical art deco design set with diamonds and sapphires on the shoulders and centring a beautifully saturated aquamarine, the perfect option if you're looking for something a little more fun.

Set with a square step cut aquamarine of approx 11.00 carats, mounted in white gold with sapphire and diamond shoulders.




Keeping on the art deco style, one of my favourite looks is a stack of deco line bracelets, and this is a great option to start with... worn stacked or alone, this gorgeous bracelet will never need to be taken off.

Set with 41 channel set step cut sapphires mounted in platinum

Now onto slightly older jewels that have been transformed to make them more wearable.

This 19th century moonstone heart is typical of it's time, it's bright yet romantic, and a wonderful gift for someone you love.

An early 20th century moonstone and old cut diamond heart shaped ring

Centred with a heart shaped cabochon moonstone framed by a border of old cut diamonds mounted in silver and gold. Circa 1900

These 19th century clusters featuring the most gorgeous bright green emeralds have been made into earring drops and look absolutely wonderful! A delicate look with gorgeous gemstones.

I absolutely love an amethyst rivièrè. Although they were quite common in the late 19th century, they are hard to find with evenly saturated amethysts, which, of course, this one has. It is a fine example of its type.

Set with 24 oval cut amethysts in a gold open back bezel setting.

I have been on a mission to #bringbackthebrooch for a while now... not quite sure if it's catching on though! One of my favourites is this super cute gold and citrine flower brooch, very "vintage" looking with gorgeous warm tones to add to those winter scarves.

Two-tone citrine and diamond double headed flower spray brooch with petals formed of square, pear and round cut citrines, the central citrines in each flower surrounded by round cut diamonds, all claw set in gold with a gold stalk

Who doesn't love a little gold hoop?! Not too big, super comfortable, with a little bit of sparkle; the perfect every day jewel.

A pair of gold and diamond hoops, Van Cleef and Arpels

half the hoop set with 3 rows of round diamonds, the other half 18k yellow gold. Signed VCA and numbered

And if you want a gold bracelet to match the earrings, look no further than this super chic Bulgari bangle. A timeless classic that will never go out of style.

I do love rubies, and I also love a good antique crescent. Combine the two and you have a gorgeous pendant! Originally a brooch but converted to a necklace, this is a wonderful stand out piece that looks incredible when worn.

set with 21 bright rubies graduating in size along the outer edge with a row of circular cut diamonds to the inside. Mounted in silver and gold

And last but definitely not least, the cutest art deco ruby and diamond half hoop earrings. Sitting close to the ear these are so easy to wear, they are subtle yet elegant and suit absolutely everyone. You really can't go wrong with these.
